Dear Customer,

Your safety is one of our top concerns.

Every year, we ask that you take a few simple steps to ensure the safety of your gas equipment. Our records show you are served with elevated gas pressure. This means that your gas pressure is greater than one-half pound per square inch.

Here's what you should do:

- Have a qualified professional, such as a licensed plumber, perform an annual safety inspection that includes your gas pressure regulators. Con Edison performed an initial inspection when your meter was installed.
- Your piping system, including pressure-reducing equipment, must meet the requirements of the National Fire Protection Association (National Fuel Gas Code NFPA54/ANSI Z223.1). You or your plumber can visit **nfpa.org** for more information.
- If any work is needed, your licensed plumber must file a "Plumber's Contractor Work Request" with Con Edison's Energy Services Department before making any additions or modifications to your piping, gas equipment, or appliances. Visit **conEd.com/es**.

Also, help us keep the public safe. Share these gas safety tips with your employees on a regular basis:

- Any gas leak is a dangerous situation. In the event of a leak, leave the area immediately, and take others with you.
